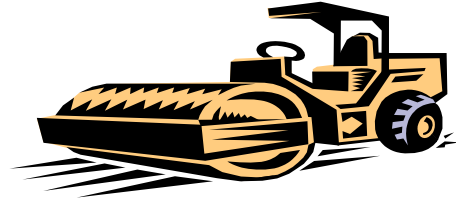

Community Paving Project:

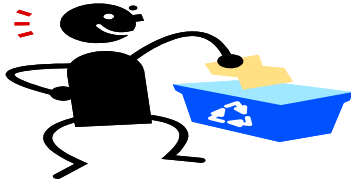
Our paving project is scheduled to begin in mid September. The Board is meeting with our contractor to go over last minute details and determine dates and procedures.

TRASH AND RECYCLES ANNOUNCEMENT.....

IMPORTANT: Beginning July 10, all residential properties in Fairfax County are now required to recycle MIXED PAPER and CARDBOARD! For more information, please visit: www.fairfaxcounty.gov/recycling.

-----CLIP AND SAVE -----

Recycles YES... Plastic and glass bottles, jars and jugs, soda bottles and cans, metal cans, non prescription pill bottles, newspapers, **MIXED PAPER**, junk mail, catalogs, phone books paperboard boxes and **FLATTENED CARDBOARD**

Recycles NO... Yogurt and dairy tubs, pizza boxes, **PLASTIC BAGS**, food containers and trays, paper plates and napkins, styrofoam containers and packing, foil tins and wrap, alkaline batteries and light bulbs.

TRASH: Please **DO NOT** place car batteries, oil, full paint cans or other hazardous materials in the trash! Empty, dry paint cans can be placed at the curb for pickup. Items such as paint, car batteries, anti-freeze or oil, can be taken to the dump on West Ox Road. For further information and specific times, please check the County web site (fairfaxcounty.gov) and click on the right side ('Trash and Recycles')

Also, please bundle all yard debris and place curbside. Loose branches and the like will not be collected, if they are not properly bundled with string, rope or twine.

PARKING... Each home has **two** assigned parking spaces. These spaces are reserved for residents and their visitors. Please do not park in spaces not assigned to you. Residents, their guests and visitors, needing extra parking, should be directed to visitor parking, the parking circle, Field Master or Blarney Stone. Parking in fire lanes, yards or on common area is prohibited.
